

PARAPERTUSSIS PARENT FACT SHEET

PARENT/GUARDIAN

Your child may have been exposed to: PARAPERTUSSIS

Parapertussis is a bacterial illness similar to pertussis (whooping cough) but it tends to be milder and for a shorter duration.

Need to stay home?

No, if the child is healthy enough for routine activities.

Symptoms

Your child may have a runny nose, sneezing, or mild coughing. Your child may cough in sudden, uncontrollable bursts. The cough may end with whooping sounds and/or vomiting.

If y our child has been infected, it takes 6 to 21 days (usually 7 to 10 days) for symptoms to start.

Spread

By coughing or sneezing.

Contagious Period

Unknown, but likely to be most contagious at the time of early cold-like symptoms.

Call your Healthcare Provider

Someone in your home has:

• Had a cough for 7 days or longer. Your healthcare provider may want to test for the bacteria. Antibiotics may be given.

Prevention

- Cover nose and mouth when coughing and sneezing. Use a tissue or your sleeve. Dispose of used tissues.
- Wash hands after touching anything that could be contaminated with secretions from the nose or mouth. Your child may need help with hand washing.
- Clean and disinfect anything that comes in contact with secretions from the nose or mouth. Use a product that kills germs.
